

BINA announces major gift

BINA, the orthodox girls high school opening this fall, is the recipient of a significant grant from Torah Umesorah, the National Society for Hebrew Day Schools that promotes orthodox religious education by supporting independent day schools.

According to its mission statement, Torah Umesorah aims "to create a society of knowledgeable and committed Torah Jews by guaranteeing that every Jewish child in North America is provided with the opportunity for a high-quality Torah education in a yeshiva/day school."

Torah Umesorah began in 1944 as the

Holocaust was rapidly destroying Jewish communities of Europe. Realizing that a Jewish education is the only way to assure the survival of Klal Yisroel, the founder Rabbi Shraga Feivel Mendlowitz aspired to build a Jewish Day School in every North American Jewish community of 5,000 or more. Today, there are 675 Torah Umesorah Yeshivos and Day Schools with a total student enrollment of more than 200,000.
